Flood Protection Meeting To Be Held At ACS

Attention

Conservationists

Residents of the Wellsville and Andover areas are invited to attend an informational meeting on flood protection, conservation, and small watersheds on Monday, May 13th at 7:30 p. m., in the Andover Central School Cafeteria.

Representatives from the Allegany County Planning Department, the Southern Tier West Regional Planning and Development Board, and the Seneca Trail R. C. & D. Project will discuss current studies underway within the Dyke Creek watershed and give a slide presentation on the successful Ischua project. Informational materials will be available to the public.

Dyke Creek is one of the small watersheds currently under study by the U.S.D.A. Soil Conservation Service within Chautauque, Cattaraugus and Allegany Counties. Other areas of study are the Upper Canisteo River, Pine Bottom Creek, Van Campen Creek, Oil Creek, Dodge Creek, Great Valley Creek, and Little Valley Creek. Informational meetings in these areas will be scheduled in the near future.
