

School Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School was called to order Monday, May 13, 1974 by William Walker, President of the Board. Mr. Jordan and the following Board Members were present: William Walker, Carl Atwell, Francis Horan, Conner Stephens and Mary K. Slade.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read for approval. Motion to approve these was made by Francis Horan, seconded by Conner Stephens and passed by 5 votes of yes.

The bills for the Cafeteria were read for approval. Amount — \$797.03. Mary K. Slade made the motion to accept these bills for payment. Carl Atwell seconded the motion. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

General Fund bills totalling \$2,154.24 were read for approval. Francis Horan made the motion to approve these for payment. Conner Stephens seconded the motion. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Title I ESEA bills were read. Total amount \$308.99. Carl Atwell made the motion to pay these. Mary K. Slade seconded the motion. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

The Treasurer's and Clerk's reports were read for comparison. Francis Horan made the motion to accept these reports. Conner Stephens seconded the motion. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

The Cafeteria report was read by Mr. Jordan. This report showed a net loss for the month of April. Francis Horan made the motion to file this report with the minutes. Mary K. Slade seconded the motion. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

The gross payrolls were read for the approval of the Board. Total \$41,459.96. Carl Atwell made the motion and Francis Horan seconded. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Bread bid has been received by the Participating School Districts in the Bid Committee Recommendations. Interstate Bakery was the bid that was designated to our area. Francis Horan made the motion to accept this bid. Mary K. Slade seconded the motion. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

A Revenue Anticipation note taken out in January was paid on April 24, 1974 with interest due — \$694.45. Mary K. Slade made the motion to approve this transaction. Carl Atwell seconded the motion. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Bus Bids were accepted by 5 yes votes. Francis Horan made the motion to accept Blovesky's bid for two school buses — one 15 passenger and one 43. Seconded by Carl Atwell. The bid prices were \$12,000 — with trade in for the 48 passenger and \$6,901.00 for the 15 passenger. Passed by 5 yes votes.

Carl Atwell made the motion and Conner Stephens seconded that inter-fund transfers be made — list attached. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Francis Horan made the motion that the sixth grade go to the Shrine Circus on May 18th. Mary K. Slade seconded the motion. Motion was carried by 5 yes votes. Correspondence was read and filed with the minutes.

Negotiations were discussed in detail. If necessary a special meeting will be held.

Joe Canale, former music teacher, has agreed to take over the Band for the Summer of 1974 for a flat rate of \$100.00 per performance and practice with a maximum of \$600.00 allowed. Francis Horan made the motion with Carl Atwell seconding. Motion was carried by 5 yes votes.

Miss Goodrich and two FHA students want to attend the National Conference in Chicago July 15 thru 18th at a cost of roughly \$150.00. Motion was made by Francis Horan and seconded by Mary K. Slade and carried by 5 yes votes.

Reports of various Conferences were received from the teachers attending. These were read and are filed with the minutes.

Mr. Jordan, Mrs. Burger and Mrs. McNeill were given permission to attend a "Certification" workshop at St. Barnabas in May. Mary K. Slade made the motion and Conner Stephens seconded. Carried by 5 yes votes.

Meeting was adjourned at 11:15 P. M.
