**LISTEN VETERAN RESERVISTS AND NATIONAL GUARDSMEN** need not use their vacation time to fulfill their military obligation at summer training encampments or cruises. An employer, is bound by law to grant the necessary leave to an employee in order that he may perform his duty as a reservist or guardsman. A reservist or guardsman must file a written request with his employer for leave for military training setting forth the inclusive dates. An employer cannot force an employee to take his vacation time coincident with the military training period. As to payment of wages while away from the job, it

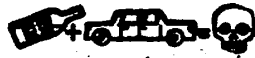
