



Richard C. Burdick

**Announces
Candidacy For
Re-election**

Allegany County Sheriff Richard C. Burdick announces his candidacy for reelection to the county post in next November's general election. Sheriff Burdick has held the post for the previous two three-year terms. He was under sheriff for eleven years and has served in the department a total of twenty-four years.

In making the announcement, Sheriff Burdick joins current undersheriff L. W. Ward in announced candidacies thus assuring a Republican primary election at the county level.

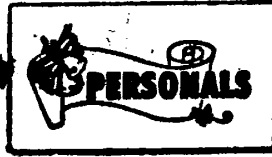
During his tenure as Sheriff, Mr. Burdick has raised the number of full-time and part-time deputies from seven to fourteen and, in so doing, has reached the mandated state level for the proper supervision of prisoners lodged in the county jail. Prisoners can be sentenced to the county facility for terms up to one year. Other improvements in the facility that have been achieved this past term include the piping in of radio music to the cells and invitation to the prisoners to make use of the Southern Tier Library System.

"Perhaps the most pressing problem facing the county residents concerning the jail is the study that is being put forth to build a new jail-office complex addition to the courthouse. I feel that, and state inspectors bear it out, something must be done with the jail. It either has to be replaced or refurbished in order to meet the absolute minimum state standards. However, I wish to make it known that I am running for the position of your sheriff —

not a county legislator — and as such will run the jail in the best possible manner with whatever the county legislators or voters decide should be done.

"Perhaps the average voter of Allegany County is not aware of the duties of the sheriff's department. We undertake a great deal more than merely guarding the prisoners in the jail, although that duty and subsequent courtroom duty does require the majority of my time. For example the sheriff's department makes many trips a year to Rossburg to connect with Livingston County deputies and receive blood for delivery to the Westville and Cuba hospitals. We handle practically all transporting of patients to the state mental hospital at Gowanda. We serve a great number of civil papers throughout the county in the course of each year. Practically no large event is conducted in the county that does not have sheriff deputies involved in crowd control and traffic control. This is all provided without charge to the communities involved. In addition to all those duties, a sheriff must be a good economist as he not only is responsible for administering an annual budget but he is responsible for the purchase, storing, freezing, danning, cooking, and serving of all meals at the jail for the year."

In addition to having served the Allegany County Sheriff's Department for twenty-four years, Mr. Burdick is a past officer of the New York State Sheriff's Association and is a charter member of the Allegany County Police and Magistrates Association for which he has served as secretary vice-president and president. He was the chairman of the Allegany County Red Cross drive in 1970 and is a 30-year member of the Friendship Fire Department. While he makes his home at the jail in Belmont, he still maintains his legal residence at his native town of Friendship. A member of the Elks Lodge No. 1495, he also served on the Crime Control Planning Commission. He is married to the former Catherine Mullane of Friendship. The couple has a daughter who is a graduate of Genesee County College majoring in police science.
