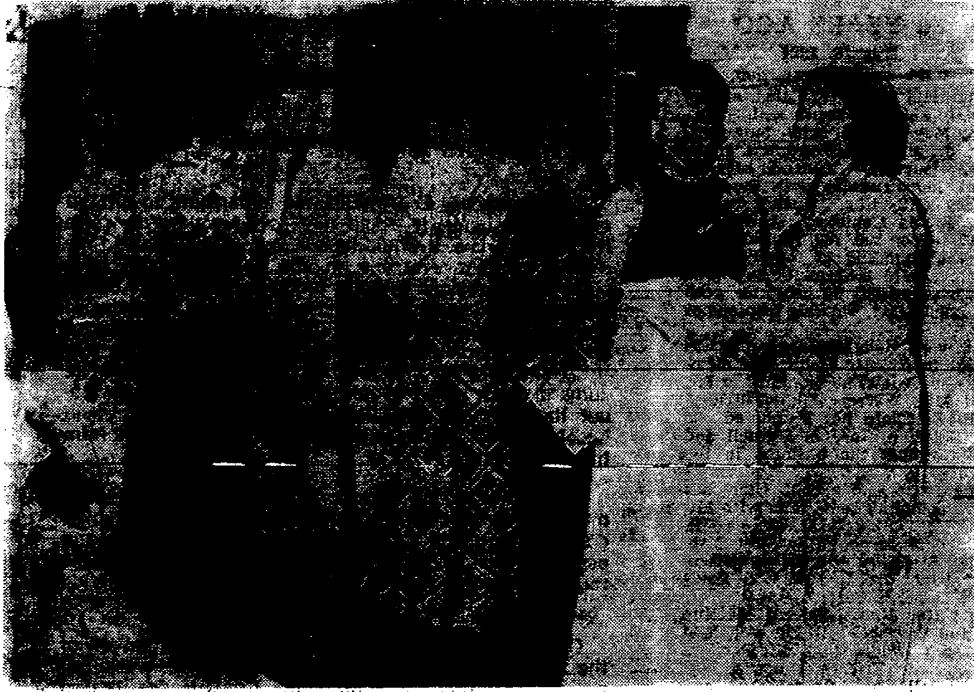

Leon B. Coffin

Leon B. Coffin, 75, formerly of Andover, died Thursday, May 23, 1974 in Francis Xavier Hospital in Charleston, S. C.

Born in Perry, N. Y., June 27, 1898, he was the son of George and Edith DeVinney Coffin. He was married to the former Vivian Mengaut Gilmartin.

Mr. Coffin graduated from Alfred University College of Ceramics in 1922. He worked for General Electric in Pittsfield, Mass.; plant supervisor for Wallace China in Los Angeles; Syracuse China; and Lenox China in Trenton, N. J.

Mr. and Mrs. Coffin and daughter moved to Andover in 1947 to start and operate the Andover China Company. In 1950 he joined the staff of the College of Ceramics where he worked until his retirement in 1970. While on the staff at Alfred he was instrumental in the research and development of numerous ceramic kilns and ceramic materials.

In addition to his responsibilities in the field of ceramics he was a lifetime member of the Mt. Morris Masonic Lodge; was a member of Keramos, a national ceramic society; and a member of Lambda Chi Alpha fraternity.

He is survived by a daughter Mrs. John Common of Charleston, S. C.; two granddaughters, Kristen and Megan and several nieces and nephews.

Funeral and committal services were held at the James B. Mulholland Funeral Home in Andover, at 2 P. M., on May 29, 1974, with the Rev. Ray Albaugh officiating.

Burial was in Alfred Rural Cemetery.

Lazy Eye Clinic

The Annual Lions Pre-School Vision Screening Clinic will be held on June 8, 1974 from 9:30 to 11:30 A. M. at the Andover Central School Cafeteria.

The Screening Clinic is for children from 4 up but not yet in school. The Allegany Public Health Nursing Department is co-operating with this Clinic and a Public Health Nurse will be there.

Mumps Vaccine Available To Pre-School Children

The Allegany County Public Health Nursing Service announced the availability of mumps vaccine to pre-school children of Allegany County through the pre-school immunization clinics and the Well Child Conferences. Mrs. Margaret D. Connelly, Director of Patient Service, stated that the mumps vaccine is recommended by the New York State Health Department to prevent mumps and the rare but serious complications that sometimes accompany the disease.

A comprehensive health assessment for pre-school children is available by appointment at the Well Child Conference throughout the County and all immunizations are available as part of this service. For information and appointment call the Public Health Nursing Service at Angelica (716) 466-7694. Locations and dates of Well Child Conferences (by appointment) are: Angelica — second Monday of each month; Whitesville — second Wednesday of each month; Canadadea — third Monday of each month.

No appointment is necessary for the pre-school immunization clinics which also offer immunization against polio, diphtheria, tetanus, measles and rubella. Location and dates of pre-school immunization clinics: Belmont Fire Hall — third Monday of each month, 2 - 4 p. m.; Cuba — First Baptist Church — second Tuesday of each month 10 - 12 Noon; Belfast — First Baptist Church — fourth Wednesday of each month, 10 - 12 Noon; and Wellsville — 86 Maple Avenue — Third Wednesday of each month, 2 - 4 p. m.
