The Greenwood School Board at its May meeting granted tenure to Michael Bronson, Secondary Social Studies teacher — and to Shirley Cook, Elementary Teacher. The Board accepted the resignation of Mrs. Jean Cornell, School Nurse-Teacher, effective at the close of the school year. Her name will be placed on the substitute list for the coming year.

The Board received a health insurance proposal from Prudential Insurance Co., as presented by Samuel C. Constatino of Hornell. The proposal was not requested by the Board, but will be given to school personnel to consider.

The Board named Edward Wazak of Wellsville as auditor for the next school budget at a fee of \$800. Dana Pickup of Wellsville, submitted a bid of \$1,000 for the work.

Board member John Driscoll, explained the blood biochemistry testing program sponsored by the Hornell and Canisteo Rotary Clubs as a community service project. There was a discussion of the District offering this program to the present eighth grade students with a follow-up when they are Seniors. The matter will be discussed with the school physician Dr. Barbara Crowthers and if arrangements can be worked out, funds for the program will be included in the budget this coming year.

Approval was given for the purchase of a 4,000 gallon gasoline storage tank.

The Board, teachers and community will be asked to discuss their interest in a continuous education program and guidelines are to be sent to the Commissioner of Education by November 1 as required. The Board directed that School Principal Gary Moore follow the same hold-the-line policy concerning long distance field trips as was established at the height of the energy crisis. More gasoline is available, but the cost is higher.

A program of eight — five week block mini courses for students in grades 7 - 12 to be given during the seventh period by community persons and school personnel was presented by Moore. The program would be in the phase of career education and partial credit would be offered.

Such a program is to be started next year if the school day can be re-scheduled to provide the time.

Approval was given to Romona Ellis to skip from a sophomore to a senior in the next school year. Moore said that other students could possibly qualify to skip a grade if they knew such action was possible.

The Board will permit the pre-

school Cooperative Child Care Center in Greenwood to use the kindergarten rooms during the summer months if liability insurance coverage permits.

Bernice Mann was appointed temporary Tax Collector until the re-organization meeting in July to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Mrs. Daisy Teribury. The position pays \$300 annually with an additional \$90 for taking the school census. The Board voted to withhold final payment for the building repair program until the molding on the front door and other minor portions of the project are completed to the Board's satisfaction. Virgil Hussey was named Chairman of the Annual District Meeting and Tom Harkenrider was named alternate.

The next regular meeting of the Senior Citizens will be Wednesday June 5, at the United Methodist Church.
