Local Pastor Attends Conference

The Christian & Missionary Alliance Church of Andover sent its pastor, the Rev. Stephen B. Clark, to the 77th Annual General Council of the Christian & Missionary Alliance, held in Atlanta, Georgia, from May 15 - 20.

The Andover Church paid the pastor's expenses to the annual conclave, which was the first time that the church has been able to send their pastor to Council. The General Council is the legislative branch of the General Society of the Christian & Missionary Alliance.

This year's Council is perhaps the most important in the Society's eighty-seven year history, because a special report was received from the Committee on Re-organization, which presented a new constitution for ratification with the appropriate By-Laws. The purpose of the new constitution is to centralize the power and authority of the Society into the hands of the President, who is elected by Council. A new restriction was placed on the executive officers in the form of limiting their years as an officer to three elected terms.

Reports of all of the officers and committees of Council were received with the election of new officers and committees. Pastor Clark reported to his congregation concerning the benefits and blessings which he received from attending Council (his first), on Sun-

day May 26. Pastor Clark served as election teller.

In the evenings, the delegates participated in varied worship services in the Atlanta Civic Center. These services featured special music from the Preacher's Chorus, a 60-voice male choir (which Pastor Clark sang in), and various recording artists. Each evening the service closed with an address by renown Alliance ministers. "Al-

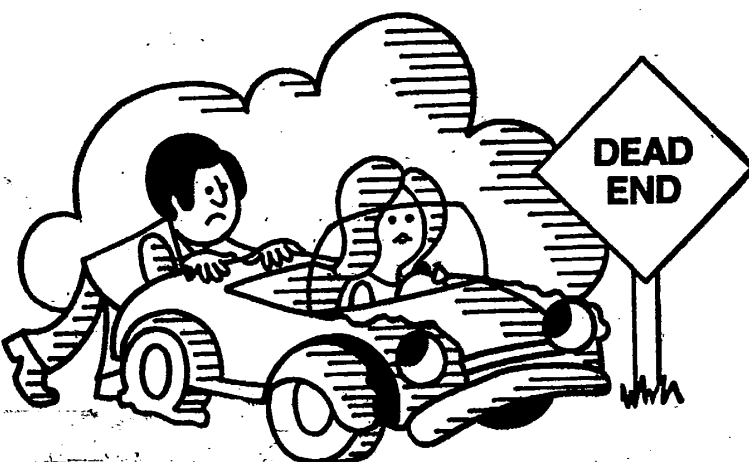

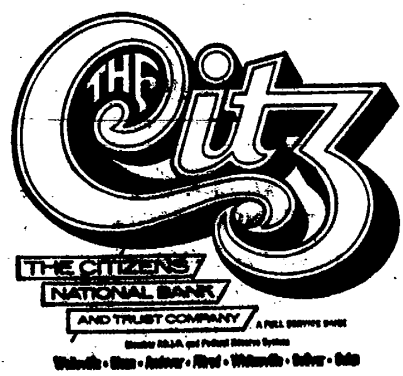
