Shawn McCormick placed third in the 330 yard Intermediate Hurdles and broke the school record in the 120 High Hurdles in a time of 19.2 seconds. Brian Halsey placed second in the Discus and John Davis placed fourth in the Mile. The Mile Relay also won its event with Ricky Cahill, Mike Bliss, Rusty Godown and Jim Jackson. Dan Davis also placed second in the 880 yard Run.

At the County Meet we had a total of 24 points and placed fifth out of ten teams. Chad Grossman broke the school record in the pole Vault by jumping 11'3". Dennis Ordiway placed 2nd in both the 220 and 100 yard Dash. Both of these seniors will go to the Sectionals at Brockport. The Mile Relay also placed second and will go to the Sectionals. The members of the team are: Ricky Cahill, Rusty Godown, Jim Jackson and Chad Grossman. Steve Haskins placed third in the High Jump at 5'3" and broke the school record in the 330 yard Intermediate Hurdles. Shawn McCormick broke the school record in the 120 High Hurdles in a time of 19.1 seconds. A fine performance by all!

The final Meet for the entire team is Wednesday, May 29, at Bolivar. The results of the Meet will be posted next week.
