Harry Kemp, Barney St. Andover, a life-long resident of this Village was honored recently by the Andover Volunteer Fire Department for his 60 years service to that Organization.

Justice Kemp was presented an engraved Firemen's Trophy and a bronze plaque by Andover Volunteer Fire Department Officials at a meeting held in the latter part of April.

The Andover Hook and Ladder Company was the first Organization Fireman Kemp joined way back in 1914 when the Volunteers hauled their equipment on a two wheeled cart pulled by hand.

According to Mr. Kemp, the Andover Hook and Ladder Company No. 1, today's Volunteer Fire Department, was formed in 1910 because the then existing Citizen's Hose Company "was called the white-collar firemen". And, after the Hook and Ladder Company was formed the other organization was disbanded.

Mr. Kemp recalls that he assisted Wellsville Firemen when the Wellsville Schoolhouse burned in 1921 at the site of the present David Howe Library. Another outstanding fire in his memory was by far the worst tragedy in this area was the Sinclair Refinery fire in 1939.

According to Mr. Kemp, the Refinery fire started on a Sunday afternoon and he, and other firemen, didn't leave the scene until Tuesday morning, after pumping water out of the Genesee River for two days to fight the blaze.

In addition to his service in the Fire Department, Justice Kemp has served in the Law Enforcement field for nearly 50 years as Constable, Deputy Sheriff and as Justice of Peace, a position which he still serves in the Town of Andover.

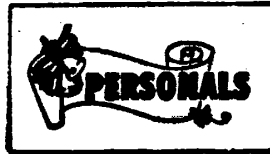
