3. Must reside in the Township of Andover

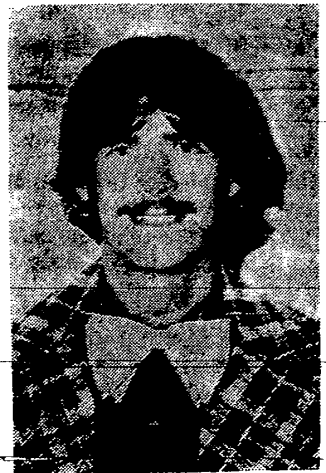

### Attention Lions & Leos

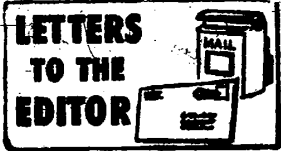
