The Spring Olympics and Ox-roast plans were decided upon. Everybody is requested to work at the Ox-Roast.

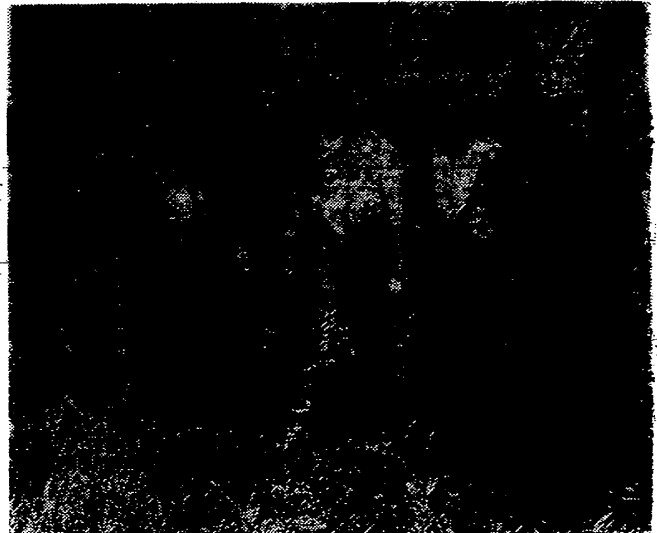

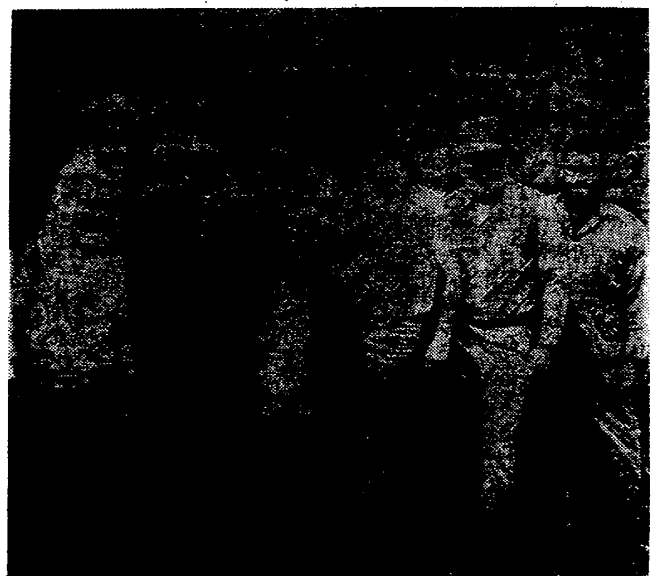

Also on the agenda is a vote to purchase two buses — one 14 passenger and one 48 passenger.

Also to vote on the purchase of Repair Anticipation Bonds for \$30,000.00 to cover the repairs needed to bring our school back in good condition.

BUDGET NOTATIONS

(1) We believe that the figure listed in the paper as additional State Aid to be received by us for 1974 - 75 — is very high. This figure was probably figured using last year's Average Daily Attendance for the best months or best in three years average. The New Formula is based on total years average Daily Attendance — 1973-74. This is going to make a big difference in the amount we will receive.

(2) Our enrollment has taken a gradual decrease over the past three years. This also will lower the amount of state aid that we receive on the new Formula.

(3) Six Dollars a thousand is a high estimate of the rate of tax increase per thousand on assessed value for next year.

(4) We are asking for a \$30,000 Repair Bond. We asked for a \$10,000 last year but did not borrow this money as we discovered that the problem at that time with the roof could be repaired using Budget Funds — it was a minor repair. We need repairs at this time on the heating — plumbing — electrical wiring. We think it would be wise to do all that we can at this time and save further expense by not letting it go any longer.

(5) Example of expenses that are going way out of sight — Duplicator paper — .89 a ream this year — next year — \$1.69. We use 1500 Reams of Ditto paper — increase in cost of \$1,200 — on just this item.

(6) Second example — we use about 10,500 gals. of gasoline. We paid 1485 for it last year. Now it is up to 2874 — Additional on this \$1,093.05 per year — without the rate going up any higher.
