The Fourth Grade boys gave a surprise party Monday afternoon for the Fourth Grade girls. It was the completion of a five week home economics course taught by their teacher, Mrs. Shirley Cook. It is under the departmentalization program at Greenwood Central School which involves Fourth, Fifth, Sixth and Seventh Grades. Mrs. Cook teaches home economics in blocks of five week sessions, one in the Fall and one in the Spring. She teaches the course for girls in two fifteen week sessions. This is the first year home economics has been taught in the lower grades. Because of BOCES, High School students have little time for a home economics elective.

Mrs. Cook, a former Home Economics Teacher at Greenwood Central School, wrote her own curriculum. It is becoming a trend and she said the State will write the curriculum for the Fifth Grade next year. She has included in Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Grades, sewing, food and nutrition, grooming and manners, interior decorating and understanding of one's self. The sewing on fourth grade level included sewing on a button, threading a sewing machine and making simple machine seam stitch. Quilts were made from scraps of material. Fifth Grade boys made butcher aprons from kitchen towels. Food class included measuring correctly and following a recipe. Both foods and sewing were taught in the Home Economics Classroom and lab. Both boys and girls learned about table setting and manners and planned how to arrange their bedrooms to the best advantage, as well as the art of bedmaking. While the boys were in home economics block, the girls were in craft class.

The boys planned the surprise party. They had frozen Kool-Aid ice cubes and made a punch using these flavors, colored ice cubes with ginger ale served with cookies, they baked.
