A Special Meeting of the Sesqui-Centennial Committee was held Monday evening, July 1, at Headquarters. There were 13 present. The Queen Committee, headed by Mel Mickle and Doris Ann Jackson, gave a most comprehensive report of decisions which they had made regarding the Queen Contest.

1. Ballot Boxes at Headquarters shall be discontinued.
2. Each candidate shall be asked to sell at least 36 plates as a qualifying step to candidacy.
3. Each candidate is asked to present a poster, with picture and short autobiographical summary of herself. The size of the picture is not to exceed 3 x 4 inches.
4. Any paid advertising is not to exceed \$50.00 per candidate paid either by herself or her sponsors. This advertising is to be conducted for one week only — July 19 - 26.
5. There will be a public ballot for election of the Queen on July 26 probably at the Grange Hall. Any qualified voter of the Town of Andover; Andover School District; or any Chapter member is entitled to vote. (If you are not a registered voter, and would like to vote for Queen, you have time to become registered at Belmont before this date).
6. Each candidate will receive a prize for contest participation. These prizes will be awarded on July 28 at the Queens' Dinner.

All of these stipulations presented by the Queens' Contest Committee were approved by the Sesqui-Centennial Executive Committee. They will stand as stated with no changes.

The Committee listened to the report from RMAAC that they will be glad to accept any funds that we may find ourselves able to present to them at the close of the Sesqui-Centennial Celebration. This also is a final decision — as it has been all the time — and no changes will be made here. We hope all will be pleased with this plan, and continue the fun and finance spirit we have seen so far.

Avon physician, Dr. Richard Collins, has been named overall campaign chairman for Assembly Deputy Majority Leader James L. Emery (R-Genesee) who is seeking re-election to his sixth term in the New York State Assembly.

Assemblyman Emery announced his campaign committee today headed by Dr. Collins who is vice-chairman of the Livingston County Republican Committee. He practices medicine in Avon with his brother-in-law.

Co-chairing the committee will be Belfast reactor John Hasper, who is majority leader of the Allegany County Legislature and an aide to Assemblyman Emery. The other co-chairman is Patrick S. Burns of Canandaigua, administrator of the Thompson Nursing Home and a member of the Canandaigua City School Board.

Assemblyman Emery's district, the 136th, incorporates Livingston, Allegany and the western portion of Ontario counties. The committee, he said, will reflect representation from all areas of the district.

Other committee members are: Richard C. Wesley of Hemlock, a summa cum laude graduate of the State University at Albany in 1971 and a 1974 graduate of Cornell Law School who is now associated with the law firm of Harris, Beach and Wilcox of Rochester.

Dana "Ron" Pickup, Jr., of Wellsville, a certified public accountant who is district president of the New York State Jaycees and past president of the Wellsville Jaycees.

Mrs. William (Fran) Fox of Cuba, president of Farnsworth Cookies, Inc., a member of the Cuba Central School Board and vice president of the Allegany County Republican Women's Club.

John Bratti, III of Naples, vice president of Vineyard Operations of the Widmer Wine Company, past president of the Naples Rotary Club and a member of the Board of Directors of the Ontario County Farm Bureau.

Mrs. Thomas (Lynn) Passamonte of Mount Morris, a director of the Young Republican Club of Livingston County.

Free Automobile Exhaust Emission Tests Available

Free automobile exhaust emission tests will be made available to motorists at three locations in the Southern Tier during the week of July 8. The announcement was made by the Region 9 Office of the Department of Environmental Conservation.

The Department's Mobile Emission Testing Van will be at these locations during the hours noted:
July 8 & 9 — Big N Plaza, Route 17, Wellsville New York — Noon to 8 P. M.

July 10 — Big N Plaza, Route 17, Allegany, New York — Noon to 8 P. M.
July 11 — Big N Plaza, Route 16, Yorkshire, New York — 1 A. M. to 4 P. M.

The mobile testing van will measure exhaust emission of carbon monoxide and unburned hydrocarbons, two significant contributors to air pollution.

A courtesy rating sheet showing test results and any specific recommendations for adjustment will be given to each motorist tested. Relatively minor adjustments in timing, plugs, and points can frequently achieve major reductions in vehicle emissions. In addition, performance and economy generally improve.

The testing program utilizes a simple method which takes only a few minutes. The return to the motorist is a reduction in pollution and an increase in performance, although there is no obligation to make the recommended adjustments.
