**HOLLAND PRESENTS MOTORCYCLE EXHIBITIONIST**

Holland International Speedway will have its sequel to Evel Knievel when Al Levine a noted motorcycle exhibitionist will perform his many fetes at the Speedway on Saturday July 13. Levine, a youngster of 19 years of age, has been performing for over two years. Last year at Perry Motor Speedway, Mr. Levine successfully jumped twelve cars in a ramp-to-ramp exhibition. He specializes in pinpoint landings with a catch ramp of only four feet wide. Levine will attempt to duplicate this fete as the culmination of his wheel standing, ramp jumping act on Saturday, July 13.

The Charger racing division will hold its Mid-Season Championship at Holland on the 13th, a double point race for all the young Chargers. In this special event, the top drivers will hold down the front starting positions. On pole will be the 1973 Holland Champion, Steve Hill of East Aurora. The 1973 Rookie of the Year, Greg Heimeuz, holds second place by a scant eight points behind the front runner Hill. Jim Root of Amherst, Gordon Burby of Corfu and Bob Boyie of Middleport round out the top five.

Defending Champion John Carpenter of Angola, continues to lead the Limited Sportsman Division in his Ford powered Sportsman. Carpenter is closely followed by Doug Hewitt of Perry and Jim Remery of Orchard Park.

The Late Model Sportsman Division finds the second year veteran, Phil Edwards of Buffalo, maintaining a slim lead over his running mate Buffalonian Ron Williams.

Racing will resume at Perry Motor Speedway on Sunday evening with practice at 5:30 and first race at 7:00. Holland's starting time throughout the summer has been slated for 7:30 each Saturday evening.
