Notice of Proposed Change in Telephone Rate Schedules

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that on June 28, 1974, Iroquois Telephone Corporation filed with the Public Service Commission rate changes to become effective on July 29, 1974. The proposed rates are included in Tariff Schedule P. S. C. - N. Y. - No. 5 - Telephone which contains rates, regulations, and explanation of terms applicable to general and local exchange service and will supersede presently filed tariff schedule P. S. C. - N. Y. - No. 2 - Telephone.

The proposed new schedule will increase revenues by approximately \$726,132 or 33.0 percent above the level generated by Schedule No. 2 during the 12 months ended December 31, 1973. However, the proposed schedule will affect individual service and charges by different percentages.

The proposed changes in Local Service Rates are set forth below:

Table with columns: Rate Group, Station Availability, Exchanges, Base Rate Area, Rate Per Month (Ind. Line, 2-Pty Line, 4/5 Pty Line, Outside Base Rate Area, Ind. Line, 2-Pty Line, 4-Pty Line, Party Line). Rows include Business Service (I-VIII) and Residence Service (I-VIII).

* Plus applicable exchange line mileage or zone increment as specified in local exchange section of the Iroquois Tariff.

Numerous other changes have been proposed. These include increases in Service Connection Charges, Supplemental Equipment Rates, Key System Rates, PBX and PABX Rates, and mileage charges. All the proposed changes are available for inspection at the Public Service Commission or at each of the following Company business offices:
