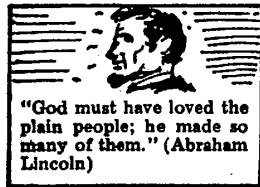

**Andover Minister Resigns**

The Rev. Stephen B. Clark, Minister of the Andover Christian & Missionary Alliance Church, Andover, New York, gave his notice of resignation in the Church's Executive Meeting on Sunday, July 14, 1974.

Pastor Clark informed the committee that this resignation does not mean that he will be leaving the ministry, though he will not be moving to another pastorate. He will be taking a "leave of absence" to continue his graduate education at the newly-formed Alliance School of Theology and Missions where he will be a candidate for an M.P.S. degree (Master of Professional Studies). The Clarks will be moving from their parsonage home at 8 Baker Street, Andover, to 241 West Clarkstown Road, Spring Valley, New York, on August 19, 1974.

The Rev. Mr. Clark came to the Andover parish from the First Alliance Church of Rochester, New York, where he served as Minister of Youth and Music in August, 1972. Prior to this, he was a graduate of Houghton College, where he studied ministerial sciences.

After two rather-successful years of pastorate in Andover, he feels that this will assist in preparing him for graduate education in ministerial studies. Since coming to Andover, the church has doubled in size and visibly prospered in every way. They have bought a parsonage, remodeling the church and developed an active ministry in the community.

Pastor Clark has also in these two years, taken unto himself a wife, the former Paula L. Dough ten of New Castle, Del.

Pastor Clark will preach his last sermon here on Sunday, August 18, 1974.

When will we begin to withdraw the American troops that are stationed in Europe?

E.L., Buffalo

I support a reduction of forces in Europe—but not a unilateral reduction. As you may know, we have withdrawn some of our forces in Europe over the past several years, while the Soviet Union has increased its strength. We are now conducting important negotiations with the Soviets on the mutual and balanced reduction of forces in Central Europe. A unilateral reduction of American forces at this time would eliminate any incentive for the Russians to continue to negotiate, thereby threatening the balance of power in Europe.

I am rather concerned about the growth of news leaks in Washington. Who is at fault here, the members of the impeachment committee or the newsmen who print the leaks?

The impeachment committee is not abiding by its own rules. It was the committee that determined that certain information ought not to be made public. I certainly cannot blame newsmen for printing what committee members and staff make available to them. On the other hand, I do think the press has overlooked a serious responsibility by printing leaked grand jury minutes. Our system of justice depends on the confidentiality of grand jury proceedings, and I do not believe that newsmen are advancing the cause of justice if they abuse that confidentiality.

I thought that Secretary Kissinger had just concluded cease-fire agreements in the Middle East. What's the deal with Lebanon? Are we ever going to get peace in the Middle East?

Much like the Protestant terrorists who sabotaged attempts by Catholic and Protestant moderates to set up a coalition government in Northern Ireland, Palestinian commandos are trying to disrupt the Middle East peace conference in Geneva by conducting terrorist raids into Israel. Because the commandos are sheltered behind the borders of Lebanon, the Israelis have launched preventive strikes into Lebanese territory. This has created another confrontation between Israel and Lebanon. One can only hope that sense will prevail over force, and that the cease-fire agreements that Israel signed with Egypt and Syria will eventually lead to a lasting peace in the area.
