PARRIS ISLAND, S. C. — Lance Corporal Margie A. Harvey is a files clerk. She also is a guard mail driver the first woman to be assigned the job here. "It's very exciting to be a first in anything," says Harvey. "As a guard mail driver the 20-year-old lance corporal must pick-up and deliver in-ra-base mail to various offices twice a day three days a week. "We used to have two males occupying this position. One of them was transferred so I jokingly volunteered. Later I really became serious about the job and got it," Harvey said. As a files clerk with the Central Files Section, Harvey is responsible for many types of administrative work. "Much of the incoming and outgoing correspondence on the base goes through our office, so we're kept pretty busy," she said. From Andover, N. J., Harvey enlisted in the Marine Corps in September 1972 for two years. Since then she has held two previous jobs at Parris Island. She has worked for the Naval Security Group, G-2, and as an administrative clerk at Headquarters Company, Woman Recruit Training Battalion. "Lance Corporal Harvey is a 1971 graduate of Andover Central High School, Andover, N. Y. While there, she participated in basketball, softball and swimming. She also attended an occupa-

tional school in Andover and received several awards for speed and proficiency in bookkeeping, typing, shorthand and in using adding machines. "I joined the Marine Corps looking for a challenge. I wanted to meet people, and I wanted to set some worthwhile and meaningful goals for myself," Harvey said. "The Marine Corps isn't what I expected — it is much more." She says working at the headquarters building allows her to attend morning colors each day. "It gets you motivated and keeps you that way," she claims. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ronald Whitesell of Andover, N. Y.
