E. James Strates, the head of the shows, who took over after his father's death, maintains strong New York State ties, even though the show is now headquartered in Orlando, Florida. He was born in Elmira, attended high school in Corning and received a political science degree from Syracuse University.

Unthreatened by radio, television or professional sports, traveling carnivals, such as the Strates Shows are now bigger and better than ever. Strates says he prides himself on the honesty and cleanliness connected with his show. "We like" he says, "to play county and state fairs and other agricultural expositions because they cater to families. And when a man brings his family to a carnival he doesn't propose to be gypped nor does he want his family exposed to smut."

precision, the show moves on a 50-car railroad train that carries hundreds of thousands of dollars worth of equipment and over 300 carnival personnel, generally called "carnies." The show features more than 100 rides, sideshows, concessions, games of chance, quick-lunch stands and animal exhibits.

Over the years modern refinements, such as recorded tapes, have often replaced the carnival barker but the atmosphere is the same. The blaring music, cotton candy, candied apples, the freaks, the rides and the pitch games are still all there.

And it won't be long before Erie County Fairgoers are once again mesmerized by the delights of an entertainment city that rises on a lot one week and is gone the next.
