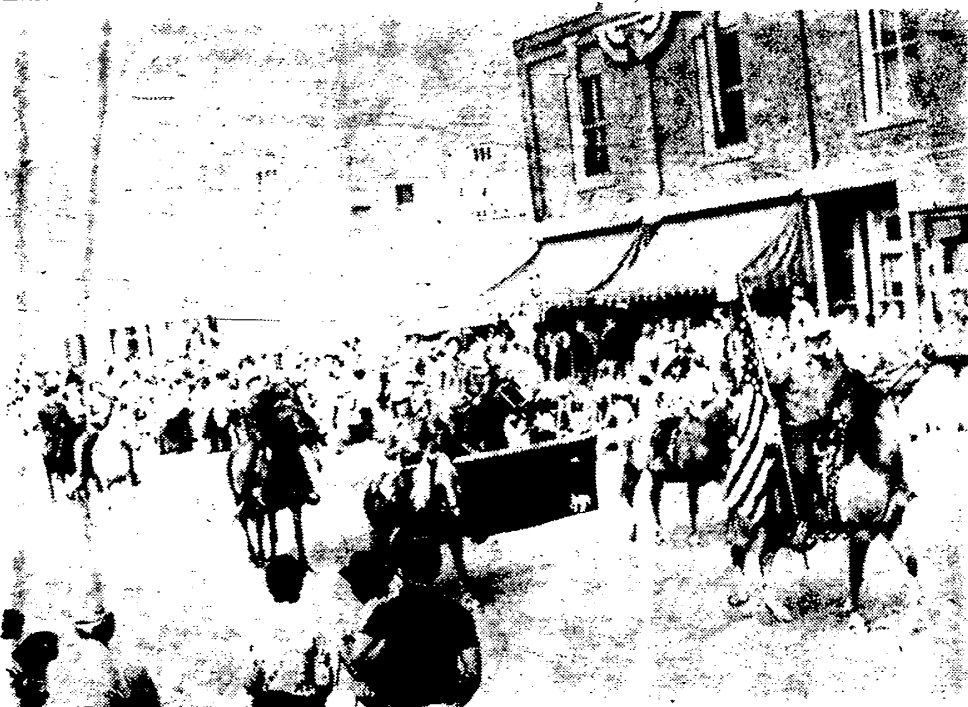


The Senior Diplomats from Johnsbury, Pa., that won the \$300 First Place in the Drum and Bugle Corps Class. News Photo

Emery Urges No Federal Revenue Sharing Cuts

Assembly Deputy Majority Leader Assemblyman James L. Emery (R-Genesee) has supported a proposal of the National Legislative Leaders Conference urging the Federal government to continue its revenue sharing program to states uninterrupted.

Emery, in Albuquerque, New Mexico, to attend a meeting of the National Conference of State Legislative Leaders, said that he is concerned with recent statements by House Ways and Means Chairman Wilbur Mills that he is seriously considering cutting off the Federal Revenue Sharing Program instituted several years ago. The Genesee Republican voiced strong support for a proposal passed at the Albuquerque meeting urging that Congress continue the program of sharing federal tax dollars with the state.

In addition, Assemblyman Emery has sent letters to United States Senators Jacob Javits and James Buckley as well as area Congressmen James Hastings, Barber Conable and William Walsh urging that revenue sharing be maintained at its present level.

"The New York State Legislature was a leader in this nation in proposing federal revenue sharing several years ago," Emery stated. "And as a result of our efforts states have benefitted greatly from this sharing of funds with the Federal government."

"I think it would be extremely unfortunate if Congressman Mills went through with his suggestion of cutting off revenue sharing at this time. I do feel that what he says will carry considerable weight since it was Congressman Mills who originally proposed revenue sharing in the House. New York State has been short-changed by the Federal government for years and is just now beginning to reap some of the benefits of the Federal Revenue Sharing Program. The money is being used in this State for many of the humanitarian and social programs which are so vital to the welfare of our residents and it would be a disaster in my opinion, if these funds
