

School Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School met on August 19. The minutes of the Annual Meeting, Reorganizational Meeting and Special Meeting were read. Motion was made by Carl Atwell and seconded by Mary Kay Slade that these minutes be approved as read. Passed by 3 votes of yes.

Payrolls totalling \$10,532.70 were read for approval. Motion to approve these was made by William Walker, seconded by Carl Atwell. Passed by 3 votes of yes.

The Treasurer's and Clerk's Reports were read for comparison. Mary K. Slade made the motion that these be approved. Carl Atwell seconded the motion. Passed by 3 votes of yes.

The Cafeteria Report for June was read for approval. William Walker made the motion that this be filed with the minutes. Mary K. Slade seconded the motion. Passed by 3 votes of yes.

The bid to supply milk to Andover Central School for the year 1974-75 from Emburst Dairy Inc. was accepted by the Board. Mary K. Slade made the motion. Carl Atwell seconded. Passed by 3 votes of yes.

Resolution was passed to participate in cooperative bidding for Ice Cream and Ice Cream Products for the period September 1, 1974 through June 30, 1975. Carl Atwell made the motion and William Walker seconded. Passed by 3 votes of yes.

The monthly bills for July totalling \$3,702.63 — General Fund were read by Mr. Jordan for approval of the Board. Mary K. Slade made the motion and Carl Atwell seconded. Passed by 3 votes of yes.

Letters were read from Charity McCormick expressing appreciation for having been granted Tenure.

John Hewes has resigned to accept a position at North Rose, Wolcott. Carl Atwell made the motion to accept the resignation. Mary K. Slade seconded, carried by 3 yes votes. We regret the leaving of Mr. Hewes who has been Andover's Coach for several years.

New Cafeteria equipment is needed. Resolution was passed to obtain same, in anticipation of partial State reimbursement. Mary K. Slade made the motion. Carl Atwell seconded, passed by 3 votes of yes.

Richard Nicol was appointed as Jr. High English Teacher at a salary of \$7,800.00. Carl Atwell moved, Mary K. Slade seconded, carried by 3 yes votes.

Permission for Jane Troxell and Charity McCormick to attend a Health Education Conference at Grossingers, October 15 thru 17th was granted. Mr. Atwell made the motion. Mrs. Slade seconded. Motion was carried by 3 yes votes.

Doris Mulconery was appointed Tax Collector for 1974-75. With the Citizens National Bank acting as receiver, Carl Atwell made the motion. William Walker seconded and carried by 3 yes votes.

Resolutions were passed to authorize the use of the Levy. Mary K. Slade made the motion which was seconded by Carl Atwell and carried by 3 yes votes.

The Audit Report of Edward Yazzak was presented to the Board for their approval. Mary K. Slade made the motion and Conner Stephens seconded. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

District Plans in Compliance with Law 241 were approved by 4 yes votes. (Plans were K-8 and 9th grade level). William Walker seconded the motion. Conner Stephens made the motion.

Wm. Walker moved and Francis Horan seconded that Marjorie Goodrich, Sara Pantton and Cindy Tomlin use the school car for a trip to the FFA Convention at Syracuse.

Miss Goodrich was granted permission to take Home Economics Class 12 to Lancaster Pa. Conner Stephens made the motion. Francis Horan seconded. Carried by 4 yes votes.

Conner Stephens moved and Francis Horan seconded that William Walker be our voting delegate to the New York State School Board Convention in New York City.
