The shortage of canning supplies is apparently national in scope. The shortages in home canning equipment appear to be affecting regular customers themost rather than new buyers of the products.

The shortages are caused by a vast increase in demand, and

vast increase in demand, and shortages of soda ash and tin plate. There are an estimated 6½ million new family gardens, this year, beyond that there is a world wide increase in demand for tin plate and an increase in domestic demand for soda ash. Environmental resrictions led to the closing of two major synthetic soda ash plants.

Mānufacturers have been doing everything possible within the constraints of supply to meet demands, working six days a week, and three shifts a day when raw materials are availabe. Inventor, ies are at record lows: there is no holding back by the manufacture. holding back by the manufacturers. We are told by industry that warehouses are nearly empty—all available canning equipment is in retail stores or enroute.
