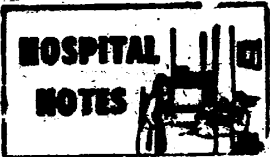

Allegany County Manpower Plan Approved By U. S.

Harland W. Hale, Chairman, Allegany County Legislature announced today that the county's Title I Manpower C.E.T.A. Plan has been approved by the U. S. Department of Labor. The County plan is a part of an overall Manpower plan of a consortium consisting of Allegany, Cattaraugus and Chautauqua counties. The Allegany County grant is for \$187,000.

Mr. Hale pointed out that the County's plan includes a work training and integrated education program for adults age 18 and up who may be unemployed, underemployed, or economically disadvantaged.

The program will consist of work training, according to individual potential at public and non-public establishments throughout the county together with vocational and/or remedial educational which will be prescribed to make an individual enrollee qualified for non-subsidized employment.

Finley F. McCoubrey of Pond Hill, Andover, died unexpectedly Sunday, September 22, 1974 at the St. James Mercy Hospital, following a massive heart attack.

Mr. McCoubrey was born in Troy, N. Y., on Jan. 12, 1904, a son of Frederick and Bellah Hyne-mann. He attended the University of Pennsylvania, and graduated from the Wharton School of Finance. He married Sylvia Hardy Reiss, a descendant of William Hardy who was one of the early settlers of Andover, on June 20, 1931 in Rutherford, N. J., living in that area until they built their new home on Pond Hill and retired here in Andover six years ago.

Mr. McCoubrey was a very successful accident and health underwriter for Travelers Insurance Co. of New York City and was a member of "The High Twelve Circle" of that Company.

Mr. McCoubrey was a member and past treasurer of the Andover Presbyterian Church; and a Charter Member and past treasurer of the Andover Lions Club.

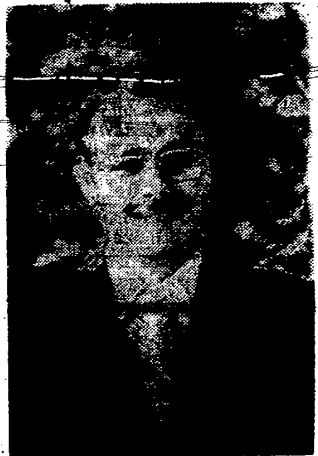
He was very active in the Masonic Order throughout his whole life becoming a Charter Member of the Order of De Molay at Troy, N. Y., in 1923 and became a member of King Solomons Lodge in Troy, N. Y., prior to moving to Rutherford, N. J., when he transferred his membership to Boiling Springs Lodge No. 152, F. & A. M. there.

Mr. McCoubrey was Master of Boiling Springs Lodge in 1949-1950; Secretary of Boiling Springs Masonic Association from 1954 to 1967; Treasurer of Boiling Springs Lodge from 1963 to 1966; Secretary of the 25th Masonic District Past Masters Assoc. from 1953 to 1960 and became a member of the Sword of Bunker Hill, Hasbrouck Heights, N. J. in 1954. He joined the Valley of Patterson Scottish Rites in New Jersey in 1955 remaining a member there until coming to Andover when he took a demit to Corning Consistory and joined the Allegany County Scottish Rites Assoc. However, he maintained his Blue Lodge membership in Boiling Springs Lodge in Rutherford and was to have received his 50 year membership award from that Lodge this coming year.

Funeral arrangements were under the direction of James F. Mulholland with Lions Club Members paying their respects Monday evening at 7:00 p. m. followed by Masonic services at 8:00 p. m.

Funeral and committal services were held at the James B. Mulholland Funeral Home at 2 p. m., Tuesday, September 24, 1974 with the Rev. Ray Albaugh, pastor of the Andover Presbyterian Church, officiating.

Interment was in Hillside Cemetery in Andover.
