Well, Grocery Shoppers, one of the few favorable reports we have for this week is in the produce line as it appears that potatoes will remain low in price for about another 4 weeks. After the crop is harvested there could very well be a price adjustment depending on storage availability.

In the meat line, steaks are the "best-buy" this week and it appears that the beef market should be down for the next few weeks which will include round steak and ground beef.

Judging from wholesale prices the new crop of tomato pack will be up considerably over current prices — and on another unhappy note, the price of bread and flour will more than likely be extremely high this winter as about 40% of the expected yield was wiped out by the drought.

As far as the sugar market is concerned, prices are rising rapidly with many stores being limited on the quantities that they can order.

Also, with the heavy freezes this past week, even the fresh vegetable market is bound to spiral upwards — so, it appears that we will have to plan on punching some new holes in our old belts.

Results of Solid Waste Disposal To Be Announced

The Allegany County Solid Waste Advisory Board chaired by Mr. Lee Ryan will soon be announcing the results of a four (4) year study of Solid Waste disposal in Allegany County.

Initiated by the Allegany County Board of Legislators and funded by the State of New York, the Comprehensive Solid Waste Planning Study began first as a joint exercise between Steuben and Allegany County. The Comprehensive Study was completed by Day & Zimmerman, Consulting Engineers, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in March 1973. The purpose of the Comprehensive study was to present alternative methods of waste disposal applicable to a two county system. Steuben County has since dropped out. Allegany County has since appointed ten (10) members Solid Waste Advisory Board to study methods of implementing a waste disposal program that will be environmentally sound and serve the most people at the least cost. This committee has hired Don MacArthur, Professional Engineer, as their consultant engineer. Other members of the Advisory Board include:
