Well Shoppers, there is a slight ray of optimism in this week's column as a few canning supplies have been trickling in this past week with a few glass canning jars and tops still on hand. Also, it has been announced that a full supply should be available by the end of October.

Despite the prediction report of higher prices of flour later this winter, the current market price is steadily decreasing with retailers offering reduced prices on larger bulk packages.

The potato market is still at a very low price and is one of the best buys of the season. In the same field of staples, the Department of Agriculture reports that there is a large rice crop and that this price is expected to be stabilized for quite some time.

In the meat line, beef should remain down for about two more weeks with a sharp increase expected by November. And, in the pork line, the situation looks rather dim for the winter due to the price of feed so perhaps it would be wise to put a little in the freezer at current prices in readiness for that "snowy day".

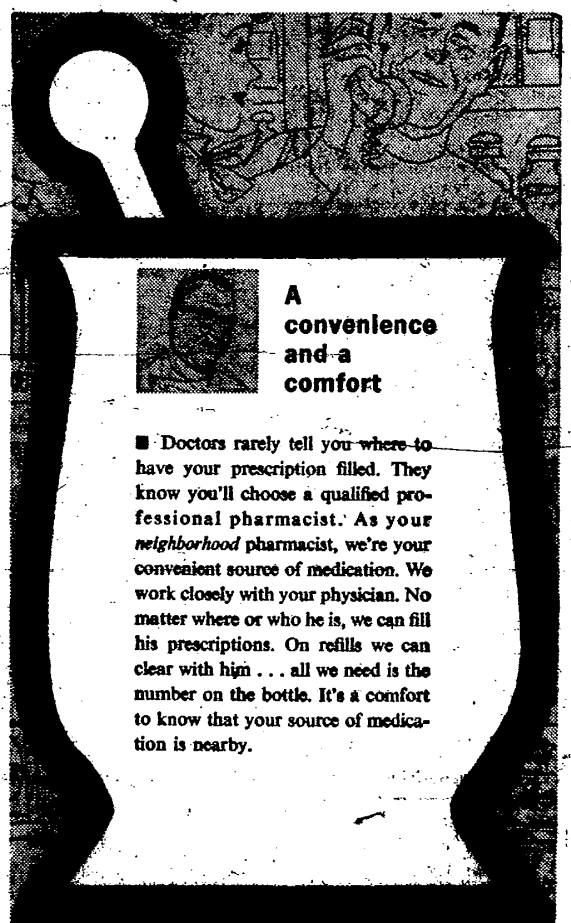
