Clean & Green Project Ends

Lee Ryan, Chairman of the Allegany County Solid Waste Advisory Board announced today the closing of the experimental Clean & Green waste disposal project, effective October 15, 1974.

The Clean & Green project, located in the Town of Willing, at the County highway garage, was part of a 40 week pilot project designed to gather specific information about alternative means of waste disposal.

According to Mr. Ryan, Public reaction to the pilot project has been overwhelmingly favorable.

Originally the County Solid Waste Board located only two 6 yard containers at the Willing site. These were emptied once a week. The public utilized the program so much that an additional container had to be purchased and pick-up increased to twice weekly. Regular inspection of the Clean

& Green site were performed by the County Sanitarian. Mr. Kruger stated that at no time did he ever find garbage or waste material scattered around the area nor did his office receive any complaints concerning misuse of these boxes. The County Solid Waste Board is forced to close down the pilot project by October 15, 1974 because funds budgeted for this survey will have been expended.

Patrons of the County project are reminded that after October 15, 1974 they may take their garbage to either the Wellsville or Willing landfill.

Allegany County intends to utilize the facts gathered from this Clean & Green study and incorporate them into its County Wide landfill plan which will be aired before the Public and the County Board of Legislators late in October.

CONSERVATION COMMENTS

Environmental Conservationist James L. Biggane today advised big game hunters planning to hunt in the Oswegatchie Primitive area of the northern Adirondacks during the 1974 season that they will be permitted to use motorboats on the Oswegatchie River to reach their hunting grounds.

The Master Plan for Adirondack Park State Land generally prohibits the use of motor boats on waters in Primitive Land areas, but leaves it to the discretion of the Department of Environmental Conservation to waive the ban for the Oswegatchie between October 1 and December 15.

Commissioner Biggane said, "The Oswegatchie River which flows through both the Oswegatchie

Primitive Area and the Five Ponds Wilderness Area is an important avenue of travel to these vast tracts of State Forest Preserve Land. The use of motorized craft will allow sportsmen to transport supplies and gain access to the more remote areas of this section of St. Lawrence County to hunt white tail deer and black bear."

The Oswegatchie Primitive Area consists of 16,920 acres of land and the Five Ponds Wilderness Areas contains 62,780 acres.

Commissioner Biggane reminded hunters that the Northern Zone big game season opened for bow hunters on October 1. The Northern Zone firearms season is from October 25 through December 3.
