**LISTEN VETERAN**

**FLAG — VETERANS BURIAL**  
— A flag of the United States will be furnished by the VA to drape the casket of a deceased veteran discharged under other than dishonorable conditions who: (a) Had wartime service, or (b) Had Mexican Border Service January 1, 1911 to April 5, 1917, or (c) If peacetime served at least one enlistment, or (d) Was released from active service because of disability incurred in or aggravated in line of duty, or (e) Had service subsequent to January 31, 1955.

**IT'S A FACT** — The purchase of a mobile home under the GI Home Loan Program does not prevent a veteran from obtaining a mortgage for a conventional home at a later date, the mobile home loan, however, must be paid in full before the new mortgage can be granted.

**THEY'RE COMING** — Those Annual Income Questionnaires for veterans, their widows and dependent parents receiving non-service-connected pension, or dependency indemnity compensation. They'll arrive with the November first checks. And they still have to be completed and returned promptly! Failure to do so could result in a discontinuance of the pension payments. With money to come by in most pensioners homes.
