### Abstract of Proposition Number One

The purpose and effect of section two of chapter 118 of the Laws of 1974, to be known as the Rail Preservation Bond Act of Nineteen Hundred Seventy-Four, is to promote and assure the continued provision of essential commuter and intercity rail passenger and rail freight services to the inhabitants of the State and to assist in the preservation and improvement of such rail services in order to meet the economic, energy and environmental needs of the communities of the State. The statute authorizes the creation of a State debt to an amount not exceeding in the aggregate two hundred fifty million dollars (\$250,000,000) to provide monies to be used, in such manner and upon such terms and conditions as the Legislature may prescribe, for the acquisition, construction, reconstruction, establishment, improvement and rehabilitation of commuter and intercity rail passenger and rail freight capital facilities, for the acquisition of real property and interests in real property required or expected to be required therefor and for any capital equipment used in connection therewith.

The statute provides for the submission to the voters at the 1974 general election of the proposition whether the provisions of the Act authorizing the creation of a State debt for the above purposes in the amount of two hundred fifty million dollars (\$250,000,000) shall be approved.

### Form of Submission of Proposition Number One

**Rail Preservation Bond Issue**

To promote and assure the preservation and improvement of essential rail passenger and freight services to the inhabitants of the state, shall upon two of chapter one hundred eighteen of the laws of nineteen hundred seventy-four, known as, the rail preservation bond act of nineteen hundred seventy-four, authorizing the creation of a state debt in the amount of two hundred fifty million dollars (\$250,000,000) for capital facilities be approved?
