NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held on November 12, 1974, at 1:30 o'clock P. M., in the County Legislators' Chambers, County Courthouse, Belmont, New York, in relation to a proposed Local Law which will establish the annual salaries of certain county officers to wit: County Attorney - \$18,000, Commissioner of Social Services - \$16,500, Superintendent of Highways - \$16,000, Director of Planning - \$15,000, County Treasurer - \$14,000, Director of County Real Property Tax Service Agency - \$13,000, Public Defender - \$12,500, Commissioner of Elections - \$3,780. If adopted the Local Law will take effect on January 1, 1975; provided, however, in the event the Local Law is filed in the office of the Secretary of State after January 1, 1975, then, in such event, the Local Law shall take effect on the date of such filing.
