Linda Regan, Vice President of the Student Council, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Lester Regan of 2792 Hillcrest Drive and niece of Mrs. Anna Richardson of Andover and John Regan, Connecticut, has been chosen by the high school faculty (upon recommendation of her classmates) to represent Wellsville High School as the school's 1975 DAR Good Citizen. Miss Regan will receive a pin from the Daughter's of the American Revolution Chapter, and a certificate of award from the national society.

In order to qualify as a Good Citizen among high school girls the applicant must possess the following qualities: 1. Dependability—which includes truthfulness, loyalty and punctuality; 2. Service—

cooperation, courtesy, and consideration of others; 3. Leadership—personality, self-control, and ability to assume responsibility; 4. Patriotism—unselfish interests in family, school, community and nation.

As part of the program, Linda will answer a questionnaire under the supervision of the sponsoring chapter, during the week of November 14. The results of this questionnaire and three letters of recommendation based on her qualities will be judged in the selection of a District Winner and the New York State Good Citizen. The State Winner will receive a pin and a \$100 bond, and the other 9 District Winners will each receive a bond.

The National Winner will be given a \$1,000 scholarship to the college of her choice and a five inch sterling silver bowl engraved "National DAR Good Citizen 1975".
