NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN by Iroquois Telephone Corporation that, by order adopted by the Public Service Commission on August 13, 1974, in Case No. 26365, hearings have been reopened to permit the Company an opportunity to update the financial data upon which the Commission will determine whether and to what extent the Company is entitled to recoup revenues for telephone service provided during certain periods in the past. Such recoupment, if any, would be for the purpose of compensating the Company for revenues which it claims to have lost as the result of a prior Commission determination in Case No. 26365 which denied the Company's application for rate relief. Following said determination, the Company commenced a Court review proceeding against the Commission pursuant to Article 78 of the Civil Practice Law and Rules, and, in view of the determination of the Appellate Division, Third Department, in a parallel case, the Commission has reopened the proceeding.

An initial hearing has been held and a further hearing is scheduled for December 19, 1974, at 10:00 a. m. at the Commission's offices at 44 Holland Avenue, Albany New York. The hearing is open to any interested parties who wish to offer evidence or statements regarding the issues of recoupment or future rates.

The amount of recoupment presently claimed by the Company is \$519,274, plus interest, through November 30, 1974, and such additional amounts as may later accrue. The Company proposes to recover that amount through a surcharge on all subscriber's Monthly bills over a period of one year.

Notice To Harborers Or Owners Of Dogs

Dog Licenses are due on or before January 1st, 1975. They may be obtained at the Town Clerk's Office.

The law requires that dogs be licensed by January 1, 1975. Failure to obtain a license subjects the owner to a penalty of \$10.00 and costs and the dog is liable to seizure.

The Commissioner of Health has issued an order requiring all dogs six months of age or over in the County to be vaccinated to prevent rabies. Therefore an applicant for a dog license must present to the Clerk a certificate certified by a duly licensed veterinarian showing that the dog has been so vaccinated.

To be acceptable, the certificate presented must show that modified live virus vaccine was used within four years immediately preceding the application date, or that killed vaccine of brain tissue or brain tissue origin was used within the year immediately preceding the application date.

If your application is mailed to the Clerk, the vaccination certificate must accompany your application and check.
