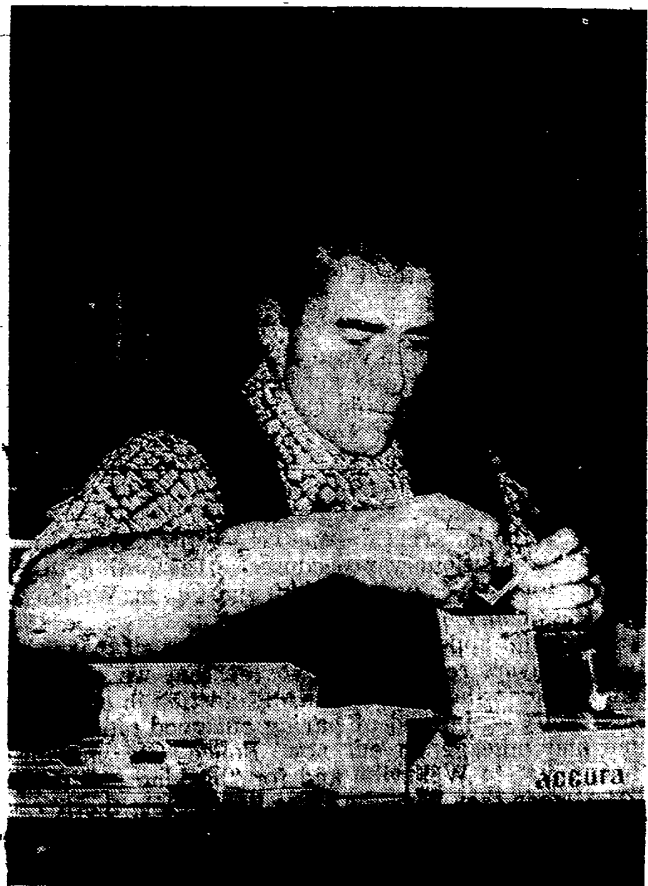
## Y.M.C.A. Offers Cross Country Ski Instruction
