Local Law No. 6 of 1975
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the following Local Law No. 6 of 1975 which became effective January 1, 1976, is published pursuant to Section 214 (2) of the County Law:

A LOCAL LAW ESTABLISHING THE ANNUAL SALARIES OF CERTAIN COUNTY OFFICERS

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Legislators of the County of Allegany as follows:
Section 1. The annual salaries none of which include any earned longevity increment, of the incumbents of the county offices herein set forth shall be the amount herein set forth opposite each such office, to wit:

§ 2. This local law shall take effect on January 1, 1976; provided, however, in the event this local law is filed in the office of the Secretary of State after January 1, 1976, then, in such event, this local law shall take effect on the date of such filing.
