Candidate Lundine 'Meets the People' At Luncheon

Stan Lundine, Democratic Candidate seeking the Congressional seat vacated by Rep. James F. Hastings R-Rushford Lake in his resignation effective Jan. 1, 1976, outlined his beliefs and ideas to help solve current problems in the Southern Tier at a luncheon held Saturday at the Andover Grange Hall sponsored by the local Democratic Committee.

Candidate Lundine who has been Mayor of the City of Jamestown since 1969, stated that he believed that the Federal Revenue Sharing Program should be continued but thought that the "Population Density" Formula now used to determine the local Revenue Share should be revised.

In other areas he commented that Federal Aid to Education should be increased under a Revenue Sharing Type of Program; that he was opposed to any further gun controls but that he believed that mandatory minimum sentences should be set up for criminals committing crimes with guns; and that he was opposed to Capital Punishment since a mistake in justice could not be corrected after the sentence was carried out.

Mayor Robert Gardner of Wellsville expressed his surprise in the large turnout of over 50 Andover residents at the rally and said that it was a larger gathering than the initial one held in Wellsville.
