**Grocery Gems & Goodies**

Hi Folks! How did you like that brief breath of "Spring" that we had Monday and Tuesday — with the mercury climbing up over the 50 mark — and the sun shining for two whole days?

There has been quite a lot of publicity recently over red food coloring so thought that maybe you good people would like to read something that we received from one of our suppliers.

In reference to the use of Red No. 2, Knouse Food Inc. wrote us "We discontinued using Red No. 2 in all of our red colored pie fillings over two years ago. This includes both retail and institutional sizes of cherry, strawberry and strawberry-rhubarb fillings.

Our spiced red rings, both retail and institutional sizes, contain primarily Red No. 40. About 2 years ago we packed some No. 10 red rings with 100% Red No. 40 but received unfavorable comments about the orange tint that the rings had, particularly with yellow-fleshed fruit. Therefore, we added just a trace of Red No. 2 to cover up the orange tint. The rats used in the F.D.A. Red No. 2 feeding study on which the ban is based consumed the color at a level of 3% by weight of their daily intake of food for an entire normal lifetime. A person, to ingest comparable amount of Red No. 2, would have to eat more than 100,000 red rings per day for a period of 70 years.

Products already packed that contain Red No. 2 are perfectly safe. Dr. Alexander M. Schmidt, Commissioner of the F.D.A., HAS STATED: "There is no evidence of a public health hazard from any currently available food or other product made with Red No. 2."

For the "Best Buys" of the week in the Meat Department: Ground Beef is 69c a lb.; Chuck Roast is 79c; and Chuck Steaks are 99c. In the Pork line, Tobins Pork Shoulder Roast is 89c a lb.; Fresh Pork Spare Ribs are 99c; Sugarale Boneless Hams are \$1.39 a lb.; and Oscar Mayer Link Pork Sausage is \$1.49 a lb.; with Armour Hot Dogs at 89c a pound.

In the Produce Department, Lettuce is 29c a head; Potatoes are 99c for a 10 lb. bag; Cauliflower is 49c a head; Tomatoes are 39c for a pkg. of 4; Pascal Celery is 49c a bunch; and Cooking Onions are 59c for a 3-lb. bag.

In the Grocery Department, all 3 kinds of Hunt's Spaghetti Sauce is 79c a qt.; Golden Wheat, elbow Macaroni is 88c for a 3-lb. pkg.; Keebler Town House Crackers are 59c for a 1-lb. box; Glad Trash Bags are 99c for a pkg. of 10; and Betty Crocker Cake Mixes are 49c for a 1-lb. 2-oz. pkg.
