Hi Folks! Tired of Winter? Then think Spring! Winter cold weather that was reported to have damaged crops has now been down graded according to California and Florida citrus industry spokesmen.

Steady supplies of Florida celery are now expected as this is one crop that shook off the cold weather. However, California crops will be below average due to a two to four inch below normal rainfall. In our "Specials of the Week" beet prices still lead the field in the Meat Department. Ground Chuck is only 89c a lb., Chuck Steaks are 99c and Chuck Roast is 79c a lb. with bone. Round Steak and Round Roast at \$1.49 per pound.

In the Grocery Department Breast of Chicken Tuna is 49c for a 6 1/2 oz. can; Ragu Spaghetti Sauce is 89c a qt.; Large Eggs are 67c a doz.; and Kraft Imitation Mayonnaise is 77c a qt.; Jack Frost 10X or Brown Sugar is 77c for a 2-lb. bag; De' Monte Peaches or Pears are 39c for a 1-lb. can; Veg. All Mixed Vegetables are 3 — 1-lb. cans for \$1; and Waldorf Toilet Tissue is 69c for a 4-pack.

In the Produce Department Mushrooms are 99c for a lb. pkg.; Florida New Green Cabbage is 15c a pound; Vine Ripe Tomatoes are 39c a lb.; Green Onions are 2 for 25c; Red Radishes are 33c for a pound pkg.; and Rome Beauty Apples are 49c for a 3-lb. bag.
