Hi Folks: How did you like that Re-run of Winter — after that brief "touch" of Spring? Trouble is that not enough people were thinking Spring!

Here are a few Newsworthy Items from the recent Edition of "Food Marketing Alert": **BEEF** — plentiful. March production is fore-cast at about 15% more than the 1973-75 March average. **PORK** — adequate. But still about 12% under the March 73-75 average. **BROILER-FRYERS** — adequate. Production about 10% above the same period above. **TURKEY** — adequate. Total marketings will be about 5% lower than the 73-75 March average. **EGGS** — adequate, but moderately under the 3-year average for the month.

For this week's Specials, in the Meat Department — Ground Chuck is 89c a lb.; Boneless Chuck Roast is 99c; Round Steak is \$1.29 a lb.; Pork Butt Roast is \$1.19 a lb.; Pork Butt Steak is \$1.29 a lb.; Corn King Wieners are 79c for a 12-oz. pkg.; and Corn King Lunch Meats are 89c for a 12-oz. pkg.

In the Grocery Department, Red & White Fruit Cocktail is \$1 for 3 1-lb. cans; Red Pack Tomatoes are 4 1-lb. cans for \$1; D-I Monte Peas are \$1 for 3 1-lb. 1-oz. cans; Vanity Fair Towels are 39c for a jumbo roll; Soft Weve Bath Tissue is 39c for a 2-roll pkg.; Applian Way Pizza, Mix is 39c for a 12 1/2-oz. pkg.; and Borden Elsie Ice Cream is 99c for a 1/2 gallon.

In the Vegetable Department, Vine Ripe Tomatoes are 39c a pkg.; Moonlight Mushrooms are 99c a lb.; Bananas are 19c a lb.; New Green Cabbage is 12 a lb.; and Radishes are 29c for a lb. pkg.

The Clergy Review

An immense problem is plaguing the world today in the realm of religion. There is a wide spread action of the reinterpretation of the phraseology, and concepts of fundamental Biblical beliefs. Such was foretold in the Bible where we are told that many will have a "form of godliness" but will deny the power thereof.

I am reminded of the words of the Apostle Paul, "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God." If we are honest

with the Bible, it will be impossible to redefine what it says, here or anywhere.

Some, who claim of themselves, a "neo-orthodoxy" of doctrine, or a "neo-evangelicalism", claim that there really is no difference between "religions", or various faiths, or messages, and that everyone is going to the same place "What is needed," they say, "is meaningful interaction between everyone." If this is the case, what do we do with the Biblical truth that tells us that there are two types of humanity; lost and saved. There are two planes of existence. Mere meaningful interaction is absolutely worthless and I feel comes under God's condemnation as "filthy rags." Peter Berger in "The Christian Century" writes, "Ages of faith are not marked by dialogue, but by proclamation." Detant is NOT THE MEANS OF ACHIEVING SALVATION. REPENTENCE & FAITH ARE.

Rev. John Wesley wrote many

years ago, what is really needed is "faith in Christ, of the heart, in the Atonement . . . Christian faith is not only assent to the whole Gospel of Christ (NOTICE THE WORD WHOLE, FOR "All scripture is given by inspiration of God) but also a full reliance on the BLOOD of Christ; a trust in the merits of his life, death and resurrection; a recumbancy on him as our atonement and our life as given for us, and living in us."

Thus there are some "fundamental matters" and thus absolutely essential matters of faith in order for faith to be that which is capable of salvation . . . 1) the belief in an infallible and inerrant Word of God; Dr. L. L. King thundered home this point when he said, "You cannot have Christ without an inerrant Word." If we could, on what basis would we know what portion to believe and what to disbelieve? 2) If Jesus Christ is not God incarnate then there is no salvation. No mere man, good, bad or indifferent, nor anyone who

is mere prophet, can die as a sacrifice for sin, and a provision for salvation. If Christ be not God, your soul be not saved. 3) Belief in the vicarious atonement, and the efficacy of the blood of Jesus Christ is inseparable from salvation. "What can wash away our sins? Nothing but the blood of Jesus!" Ephesians 1:7 says that redemption is "through His blood." 4) There is no salvation until one

recognizes himself as lost. For how can one be saved until he be lost? The Scripture is very clear

— "For ALL have sinned —" "There is none righteous, no not one —" "ALL we like sheep have gone astray —"

There are fundamental beliefs necessary for salvation . . . Beloved, have you experienced these in life? You can . . . Come to Christ NOW!
