Her schooling has given her majors in math, science, music and Latin, all of which tie in exceptionally closely with her future plans...

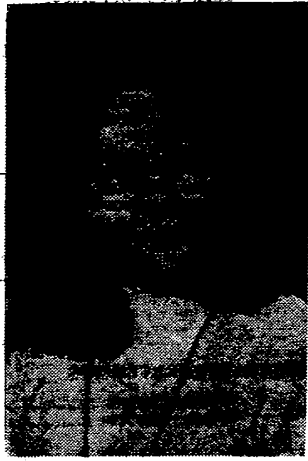
30 Weeks Test Schedule
