Democratic Primary To Be Held Tuesday April 6

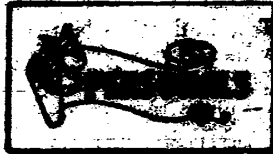
Democratic Primary will be held on Tuesday, April 6, 1976. The Hours are: 12:00 Noon to 9:00 P. M.

For this week's Specials, in the Meat Department, Beef Liver is 49c a lb.; Chuck Roast is 69c; Chuck Steaks are 89c; Round Bone Shoulder Roast is 99c; Rib Steak are \$1.49 a lb.; and Rib Roast is \$1.59 a lb. In the Pork Line Pork Butt Roast is \$1.19 a lb.; Pork Butt Steaks are \$1.29; and Smoked Chops are \$1.59 a lb. Sugarale Braunschweiger is 69c a lb.; Kery Skinless Wieners are 89c a lb.; and Red & White Luncheon Meats are \$1.09 a lb.

Vaccines will be brought by the Public Health Department of Allegheny County.

Should enough vaccine not be available on that date immunization will be held Monday, April 12.

Notices will be sent home Friday and consent forms must be returned by Monday, April 5.

Children should receive this live vaccine if:

1. They had vaccine before 1 year old.
2. They had the killed virus vaccine.
3. They had the live vaccine with gamma globulin.
4. They received vaccine before January 1967.

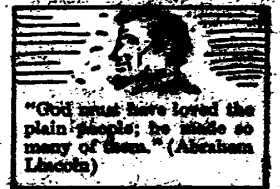
