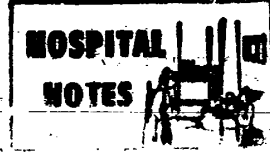
We really did enjoy that — and perhaps that's what really breathed a spark back into us so that we could keep going.

## School Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular meeting of the Andover Central School Board of Education was called to order Monday, April 12, 1976 by the President, Mary K. Slade. The following Board Members were present: Francis Horan, Clerk; Carl Atwell and Conner Stephens. Others present were: Doris Mulconery, Donald Mulconery, Doris MacMichael, Philip MacMichael, Virginia Milligan, Larry Godown and Doris Godown.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read for approval. Carl Atwell made the motion and Francis Horan seconded. Passed by 4 votes of yes. The minutes of the Special Meeting of April 9, 1976 were read and approved. Motion made by Carl Atwell and seconded by Francis Horan. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

The Treasurer's Report was read for comparison with the Clerk's Report. Carl Atwell made the motion and Francis Horan seconded. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

General Fund bills for \$24,365.08 were approved for payment. Carl Atwell made the motion and Francis Horan seconded. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Gross payrolls were read for the approval of the Board. The total of these was \$43,289.28. Francis Horan made the motion and Conner Stephens seconded. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Motion made by Carl Atwell, seconded by Conner Stephens, that the Cafeteria report be filed with the minutes. This showed a net loss of \$483.20. Approved by 4 votes of yes.

A list of the interfund transfers was presented to the Board. Carl Atwell made the motion that these be accepted and Francis Horan seconded the motion.

Cafeteria Warrant for \$2,556.21 as certified by Mr. Jordan, was presented. Conner Stephens made the motion to accept this as read and Francis Horan, seconded the motion. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Bus garage warrant to be paid in the amount of \$11,189.46. Francis Horan made the motion seconded by Conner Stephens. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Resolution to continue teachers aides out of General Fund monies (Title I) program until end of present school year. Francis Horan moved on this resolution, seconded by Conner Stephens. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Resolution to appoint Rev. A. Baugh as Chairman of Annual Meeting May 4, 1976 and Francis Vickers and Jean Jackson as Tellers.

Resolution made by Francis Horan that the Board hire Franklin S. Pilling, Jr. to teach Sixth Grade starting Fall 1976. Carl Atwell seconded. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Resolution made by Conner Stephens that the Board hire Peter Michael Caya to teach 7 - 12 Grade Science starting Fall of 1976. Seconded by Carl Atwell. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Resolution made by Francis Horan that the Board allow student Rick Rouse to work at Wegmans in Hornell on a work study program. Seconded by Carl Atwell, passed by 4 votes.

Resolution made by Conner Stephens that Jason Sibble was given permission to attend the Andover Central School from the Wellsville District provided that no changes will be necessary in the Andover Central School transportation routes. Seconded by Carl Atwell. Passed by 4 votes.

Resolution to transfer \$600.00 that was used by the three members of the ACS Faculty for the Career Education Program until funds are received to cover the expenses was made. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Meeting adjourned at 11:07 by motion of Carl Atwell.
