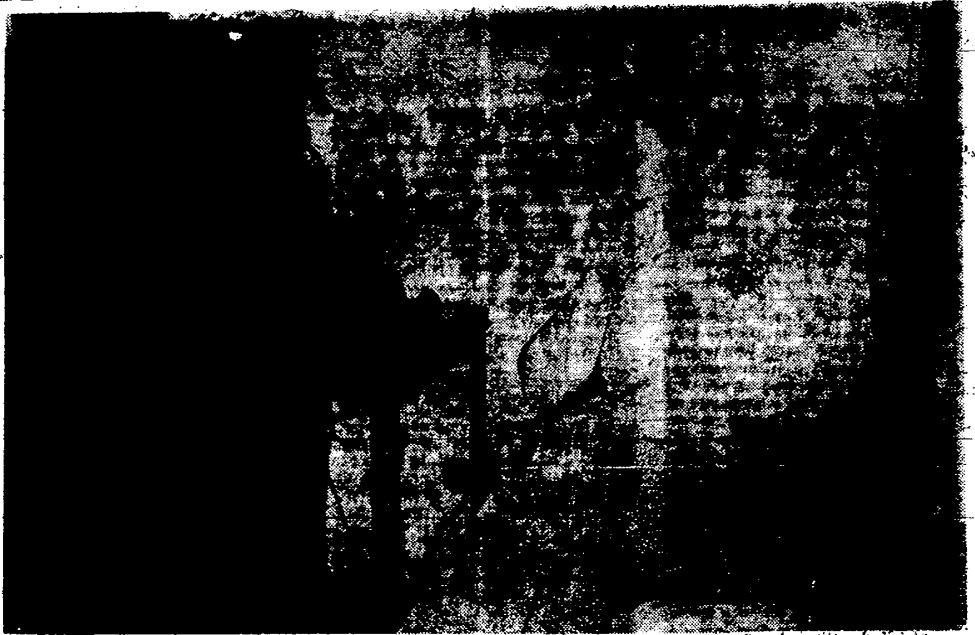

Mr. and Mrs. Judson Stearns of Alfred, are parents of a daughter born March 13.

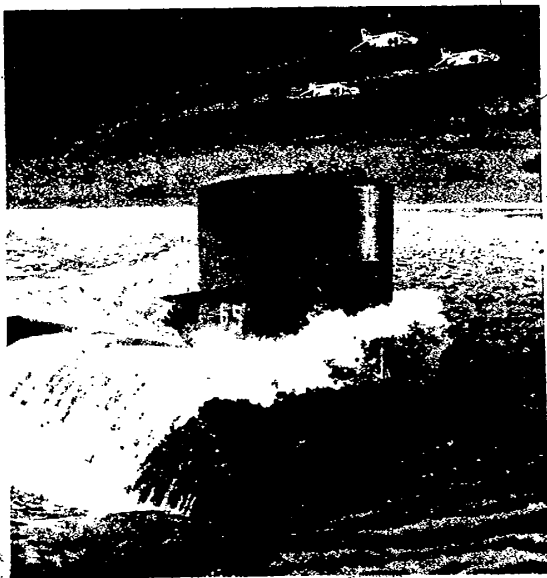
