

Village Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees was held in the Village Office March 10th at 7:30. Those present: J. Michael Brace, Mayor; Avery R. Mead, Harold Rice, and Paul Hyland, Trustees; David Rossman, Acting Working Supt. and Mike Smith.

Minutes of the regular meeting held February 11th were read and approved on a motion made by Paul Hyland and seconded by Harold Rice.

Minutes of Grievance Day held Feb. 17th were read and approved on a motion made by Harold Rice and seconded by Paul Hyland.

Minutes of the Tax Sale held March 6th were read and approved on a motion made by Paul Hyland and seconded by Harold Rice.

Moved by Harold Rice and seconded by Paul Hyland to have the Mayor support Mayor Gardner's suggestion of all Village officials being included in the Allegany County Directory and writing the Legislators of this decision.

There will be a meeting concerning the landfill held in the Municipal Building in Wellsville March 15, at 7:30 which the Mayor and Trustees will attend.

There will be a meeting of the Mobile Radio District held in the Courthouse in Belmont on March 26, 1976, at which time Ken Stayer of the Crime Control Commission will be present. Officer Howe and Trustee Mead will attend this meeting.

The results of the tree survey made by Al Winslow, Mayor Brace, Paul Hyland and Dave Rossman have been completed and are on file in the Village Office.

Moved by Avery Mead and seconded by Paul Hyland for Mayor Brace to attend a Local Government Conference to be held in Albany March 22, 23, and 24th and for expenses to be paid from the General Fund.

A joint meeting of the Village Town and Recreation Committee will be held in the Village Office at 7 P. M., March 22, 1976.

A request was received from the Andover Fourth of July Association for the Village to update the electric on the school grounds and to take care of the traffic problems that arise during the two day celebration.

Mike Smith was present to see if his request as to his sluice, electric line and water situations had been considered. The Town and Village will work together to remedy the sluice situation; the electric line will be repaired when a pole is available and the water situation was tabled until such time as a cost estimate, and time factor could be considered.

Mayor Brace has proclaimed April 4th to 10th as Bicycle Safety Week. This will include a program in conjunction with Andover Central School and the Police Department, in making the public aware of bicycle safety. A bike rodeo will be held April 10th.

Harold Rice gave a report on a meeting he attended in Elmira concerning the Railroad and the Department of Transportation.

Moved by Harold Rice and seconded by Avery Mead for the C. M. & A. Church to move a mobile home next to the church to be used for educational facilities.

Moved by Avery Mead and seconded by Paul Hyland to accept the following Police Report for the month of February: Complaints 8; Investigations — 7; Misc. Calls and Requests — 9; Accidents — 2; Doors and Windows Open — 0; Total Arrests — 5 (Traffic 4, Criminal 1, Village Ordinance 1); Parking Summonses Issued — 3; Property Checks — 2; Court Appearances — 4; Patrolman Bissell's Hours 56; Mileage on Patrol Vehicle 28,000, month of February 1,000.

The report of the Department of Public Works was read, discussed and placed on file.

Avery Mead moved and Paul Hyland seconded the following resolution to be sent to Governor Carey:

WHEREAS: The Village of Andover is proposing an extremely conservative budget, and for past years has exercised prudence in budgetary expenditures,

WHEREAS: the current proposed cut in State Aid per Capita and Revenue Sharing would be unbearable;

NOW THEREFORE be it re

solved: The Village of Andover is adamantly opposed to any per capita and revenue sharing cuts in the coming year.

Vouchers as per abstract No. 10 of 75/76 was audited and approved for payment in the following amounts: General \$227.55; Water \$506.68 and Electric \$1810.41.

This concluded the business and the meeting was adjourned.
