Public Campsites Will Open Friday May 28

The camping season at public campsites operated by the Department of Environmental Conservation in the Adirondacks and Catskills will open on the start of the Memorial Day Weekend, Friday, May 28. Environmental Conservation Commissioner Ogden Reid announces.

Commissioner Reid said camping charges are the same as during the 1975 season with a \$3 per night charge at all campsites except the Lake George Island and a few sites at Ausable Point where \$3.50 per night is charged.

The campsite reservation system has been revised for the 1976 season to provide camping for both the reservation camper and the first-come, first-served camper at each of the 46 public campsites operated by the Department. In addition, any unused reservation site will be available for first-come, first-served campers.

Although camping does not get underway until May 28, reservations for Department campsites may be made starting on April 19.

Reservations may be obtained at Ticketron direct sales outlets or by mailing applications to Ticketron, Inc., Department CG, 1350 Avenue of the Americas, New York, New York 10019. Reservations cannot be made by phone at campsites or at Department Regional Offices.

Ticketron will collect a single \$1.50 fee for each reservation and will also collect in advance for the Department's normal campsite fee of \$1.50 per night. For example, a typical four-day reservation would cost the camper a \$12 campsite fee plus a \$1.50 Ticketron fee, totaling \$13.50 for the entire stay.

A camper who purchases a reservation will be assured of adequate space for his type of camping equipment, but not for a specific numbered site. A reservation can be made as much as 90 days in advance of the starting camping date, or as late as Saturday for the next Friday starting date. A reservation can be made to start any day of the week for a period of four to 14 days. Four is the minimum number of nights reservable.

An information/reservation form giving details of the reservation system is available at all Ticketron outlets, Department Regional Offices and sub-offices, the Bureau of Recreation Operation's Albany office and at each campsite.

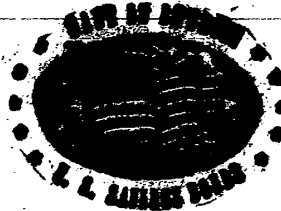
