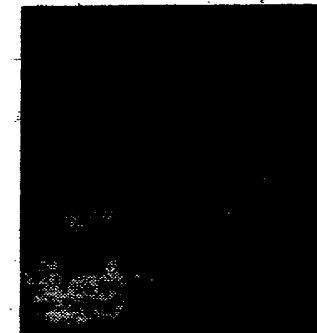

Mr. and Mrs. Grant Fuller are parents of a daughter born April 21 at Tullar Maternity Hospital in Wellsville.

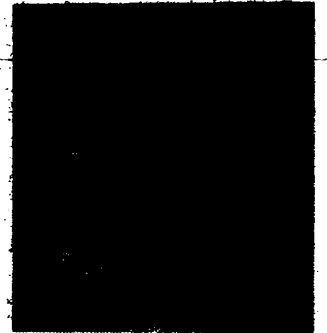

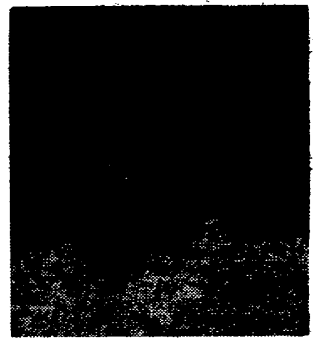
