**ACID RAIN THREATENS ADIRONDACK LAKES**  
 MAY 5 (UPI) - A fishing season is kicked off, and angler enthusiasm is soaring as high and fast as the clouds, we learn that the "acid rain" has not only spoiled the weather, it has already severely damaged fish populations in large areas of the Adirondacks, according to a report.

The problem is directly related to clean air and "acid" rain is a term that has been before Congress for over a year, and that is right now undergoing intense discussion. The issues being considered are complex and of great importance to the country, but acid rain and the problem it creates should be broadly discussed.

Acid precipitation, a more correct term, is caused by the release of sulfur and nitrogen oxides into the atmosphere as the result of fossil fuel combustion. When carbon dioxide is released by the stacks, at least in an appreciable amount, it is several years now the oxides have been converted in the atmosphere to strong acids which eventually fall to the ground as acid precipitation - "acid rain." Despite the protection afforded the Adirondacks by generations of New Yorkers, the damage is coming from industrial stacks hundreds of miles away. And, the problem was created by attempts to clean up these stacks.

The extent of the damage to fish populations is alarming. Due to the low acid neutralizing (buffering) capacity of many bodies of water in the Park, fish populations have declined, disappeared or become endangered in 11,546 acres of Adirondack lakes and ponds primarily because of acid precipitation. According to the APA report, waters at 2,000 feet elevation and greater seem to be most easily damaged by this threat from the clouds.

Two-thirds of the lakes in five State Wilderness areas in Herkimer County (Five Ponds, Pigeon Lake, Pepperbox, West Canada Lakes, and Ha-De-Ron-Dah) are chemically unsuitable for the survival of fish, says the report carried in the Sport Fishing Institute Bulletin. Adverse effects on other aquatic life and ecosystems are also occurring. Although Adirondack plants and animals presently appear capable of neutralizing acids introduced by precipitation, their capacity to continue doing so is unknown. While no decreases in forest production in the Adirondacks have been shown, undesirable reductions in the plant growth are generally observed unless the acid precipitation problem is solved.

The upshot of all this is that there will not be any trout rising this year in many of the Adirondack waters. The Department of Conservation and a number of private individuals, are experimenting with lime in neutralizing lakes and ponds. The results are now a blank. With the prospect of ever increasing amounts of high-sulfur coal being used in this country, an easy answer to the problem seems remote. However, our scientists and technology have brought us out of knotty situations before and environmentalists must insist that industry is working on this one.

Spring showers will continue to warm the Adirondack lakes and streams and freshen the air. As one drifts a wet fly or trolls a spoon during the silver-patter and rolls of thunder, Mother Nature will not seem so friendly this year. That silver-patter is a death knell to certain of our wild waters.
