Due to the low acid neutralizing (buffering) capacity of many bodies of water in the Park, fish populations have deckined, disappeared or become endangered in 11.546 acres of Aditontiack lakes and ponds primarily because of acid precipitation, according to the APA report. Waters at 2,000 feet elevation and greater seem to be most easily datased by this instant from the cloud.

Two-thirds of the lakes in five State Wilderness areas in Herkinster County (Five Ponds, Pigeon Lake, Pepperbox, West Canada Lakes, and Ha-De-Ron-Dah) are chemically unsuitable for the survival of fish, says the report carried in the Sport Finning Institute Bulletin. Adverse effects on other aquatic life and geografies are also occursing. Although Adironcek plants and the essently appear capable of heditalizing acids introduced by precipitation, their capacity to continue doing so is unknown.
