Pre-School Kindergarten Registration for 42 entering students took place at Andover Central School on May 4 and 5.

While the soon-to-be students became acquainted with the kindergarten teachers, Mrs. Lyn Griffiths and Miss Marjorie Johnston, the parents had an opportunity to attend a meeting with many of the staff.

The meeting chaired by Mrs. Charity McCormick, also included the following personnel: Mr. Frank Russell, Elementary Principal; Mrs. Barbara Stafford, Speech Therapist; and Mr. William Hawkins, School Psychologist. The above mentioned kindergarten teachers were also introduced.

Parents viewed a video tape production of the pre-kindergarten assessment program which was taped here at ACS last August.

At the close of the morning sessions, parents and kindergartners ate lunch in the cafeteria.

Any parent who was sent a registration notice for these two days and could not come, should contact Mrs. McCormick and make arrangements to meet with registration requirements.

The pre-kindergarten assessment program at ACS will be held July 6, 7, 8, and 9. Specific dates will be sent to each kindergartener in the near future.

This program is also open to children who are 3 and 4 years of age whose parents would like an evaluation to see if they do fall in normal standards of physical, social and mental development.

If problems are recognized in this age group the child may become a part of a special program through BOCES. The program will start in September.
