HOLLAND INCREASES COMPETITION

Holland International Speedway will continue its 1976 program with Stock Car Racing for the three Divisions this Saturday, May 15. Taking part in the 15-race program will be the racing divisions of Late Model Sportsman, Limited Sportsman and Challengers, and a special appearance of the Canadian-American Midget Racers. These small but extremely swift open cockpit racers will present a complete show with 1975 Champion Vince Christiano and Second Place Winner Harry Macy favored to win the first of three Midget events scheduled at Holland for 1976.

Competition has been the trademark of racing at Holland over the past 17 years. This year, the competitions increased with innovations by the speedway management. The cost has been an escalating factor in racing, many times forcing out of competition, the part time weekend competitor. Holland established a \$65 tire rule to eliminate the high cost of tires. Most recently, certain race tires cost in excess of \$100. Starting June 1, all tires are limited to the \$65 maximum. In the opening time trial, Bill Watson of Toronto driving a Firebird prepared by Bruce Putney of East Aurora made believers of both competitor and spectator alike when he set fast time with a car equipped with the \$65 tire. By so doing, he defeated many other competitors using more expensive tread wear. In addition, only 7/8ths of a second separated the fastest and slowest in the Late Model Sportsman time trials.

Dave Sutton of West Valley, the official starter at Holland for the past ten years, displayed an ability to compete by turning in a respectable fifth place finish in the Challenger Division time trials. During the season, Sutton will be serving double duty, both as a competitor in the Challenger Division and as the official starter for the Late Model and Limited Sportsman Divisions.

This Saturday, gates open at 5:30 p. m. with practice at 6 p. m. and the First Race at 7:30. Reduced prices are offered with General Grandstand Admission at \$3.50, Children (10 - 14) \$1.50 and children under ten FREE.

LATE MODELS RETURN TO PERRY

After a year's absence, the highly popular Late Model Sportsman will return to Perry Motor Speedway in Perry, New York on Sunday, May 16 starting at 2:30 p. m. Rounding out the 12-Race Program at the 1/4 mile asphalt speedway will be the Limited Sportsman and Challengers.

A new entry making his first appearance in the Late Model Sportsman Division will be hometown favorite, Doug Hewitt of Perry. Long a popular competitor in the Limited Sportsman Division, Hewitt will be competing in a 1976 Camero sponsored by DeWitt Trucking. To assure Hewitt of the best possible equipment, DeWitt even provided a large garage in the Perry area for construction and maintenance of the Camero. Long successful in sponsoring the Modified Sportsman of Richie Evans, DeWitt will be seeking the same degree of success in the Late Model Sportsman Division. Another popular competitor returning to Perry will be Ed Anchor of nearby Pavilion. For the 1976 season, Anchor has chosen his own sponsored-prepared Camero. Other entries include returning Champion Art Clark of West Seneca former NASCAR National Champion Billy Rafter of Buffalo, perennial favorite Dick Flieg of Eggersville.

With the graduation of Hewitt to the Late Model ranks, local speedster Paul Weber of Perry and Doug Pringle of Silver Springs will be vying for top honors. To locals, the number one threat is Charlie Newman of Buffalo, who two years ago won nine straight features.

Returning to Sunday afternoon racing at the Speedway will emphasize family entertainment. Adult prices have been lowered to \$3.00, Children (10 - 14) \$1.50 and under 10 FREE. Gates open at 12:30 with Practice between 1 - 2:30 p. m. For more information, call 537-2272.

Local Law No. 1 of 1976

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the following Local Law No. 1 of 1976 which became effective April 29, 1976, is published pursuant to Section 214 (2) of the County Law:

A LOCAL LAW INCREASING THE AMOUNT OF THE MUTUAL SELF-INSURANCE RESERVE TO \$300,000.00

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Legislators of the County of Allegany as follows:

Section 1. Paragraph number "15" of Local Law No. 1 of 1966, "A Local Law in Relation to the establishment of a Plan of Mutual Self-Insurance", as last amended by Local Law No. 3 of 1971, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"15. A self-insurance reserve for the plan is hereby established. The maximum amount which shall be contributed to such reserve shall be \$300,000."

§ 2. This Local Law shall take effect on the date it is filed in the Office of the Secretary of State.
