In the Beef line, Boneless Chuck is 99c a pound; Boneless Round Steaks are \$1.29 a lb.; Boneless Bottom Round Roast is \$1.39 a lb.; and Cube Steak is \$1.79 a lb. Combination Pack Pork Chops are \$1.19 a lb.; Center Cut Rib Pork Chops are \$1.49 a lb.; and Family Pack Frying Chickens are 43c a pound.

In the Grocery Department Kraft Mayonnaise is 98c a qt.; Kraft Dinner Macaroni is \$1.00 for
