Commander Swartz will explain the purpose of Memorial Day and introduce Debbie Buckwalter, Co-Valedictorian of the Class of '76 at ACS, who will recite "In Flanders Fields".

Curt Vars, alternate winner of a State Regents Scholarship in the Senior Class at ACS, will then be introduced to present "The Grange News".
