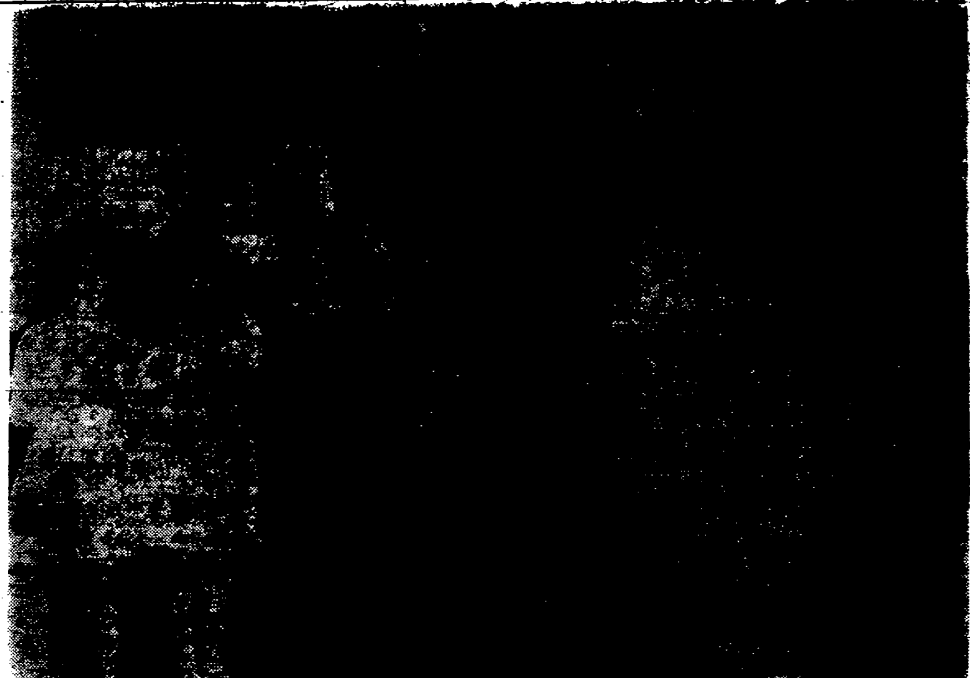
O'well what I say is, "If you don't know the material by now you never will." But if you don't know it - you better start cramming - Good luck on your tests.

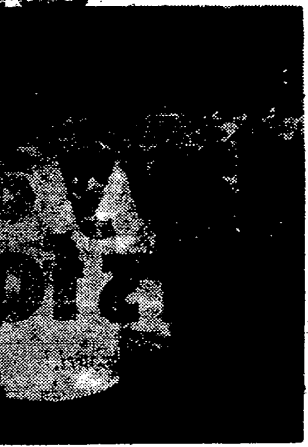

Local Students Win Tree Bucking Trophy

James Sparatta and Andrew Jackson of Andover Central School won the first place State Trophy for Tree Bucking, in a contest sponsored by the Future Farmers of America at their Annual State Convention held this year in Batavia.

The contest required the cutting of sixteen foot logs into four poles, on a cutting block, and then stacking them in a pile. They were judged for straightness of cut and length. Safety was also an important factor.

Jim and Andy had the fastest time - two minutes, sixteen seconds; of a possible 100 points, they earned 82.

The Allegany County BOCES Conservation Class won the State Trophy for most points in overall BOCES competition in the field of conservation and heavy equipment operations.

Boys Baseball

On May 17, Whitesville traveled to Andover only to be defeated by a score of 1 - 0, leaving Andover's record at 5 wins and 1 loss.

In the first game of a double-header, Andover defeated Whitesville 3 - 1. Tim Mead pitched for Andover and recorded his third straight shut-out. Tim gave up a hit, 6 runs, 1 walk, and registered 4 strikeouts. Jay MacMichael and Rob Hyland led the Andover hitting attack with a double apiece. Gary Barden, Tim Mead, Dale Russell, Lou Spencer and Rex Vorburg each added a single for Andover.

In the second game Andover again defeated Whitesville this time

by a score of 7 to 1. Pat Atwell started for Andover and went 3 1/2 innings giving up 1 run, 3 hits, 2 walks, and registering 3 strikeouts. The 1st and 2nd innings were in for Andover to put out the fire and preserve the victory. Tim gave up 0 runs, 1 hit, 2 walks, and registered 4 strikeouts. This puts Tim's personal win-loss record at 6 wins, 0 losses. Tim also has pitched 26 innings in a row without giving up a run. Dale Russell led Andover with 3 singles. Jay MacMichael followed with 2 singles, and Tim Mead, Steve Scott and Pat Atwell also added a single apiece.
